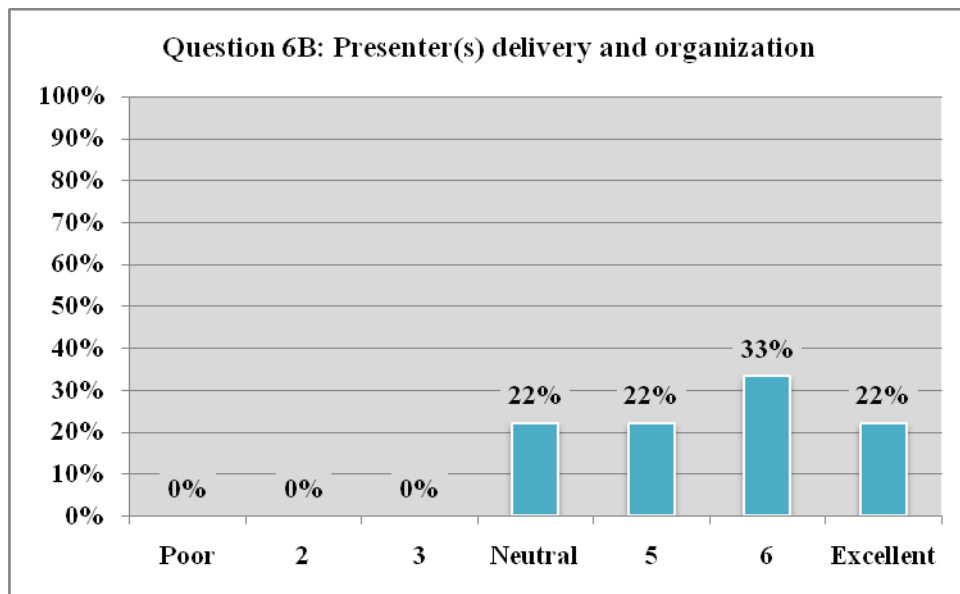
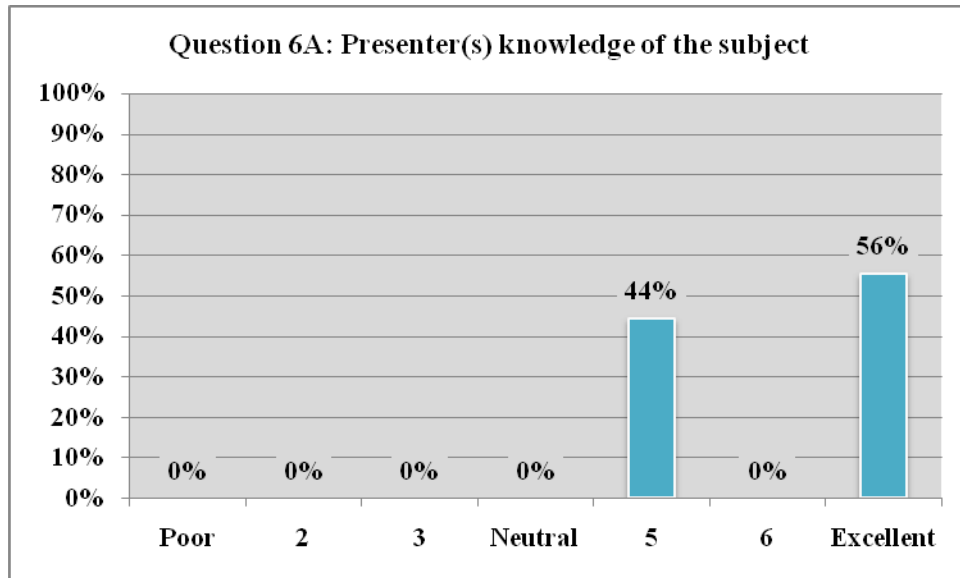
Question 4: How would you rate the originality/uniqueness of workshop/panel?

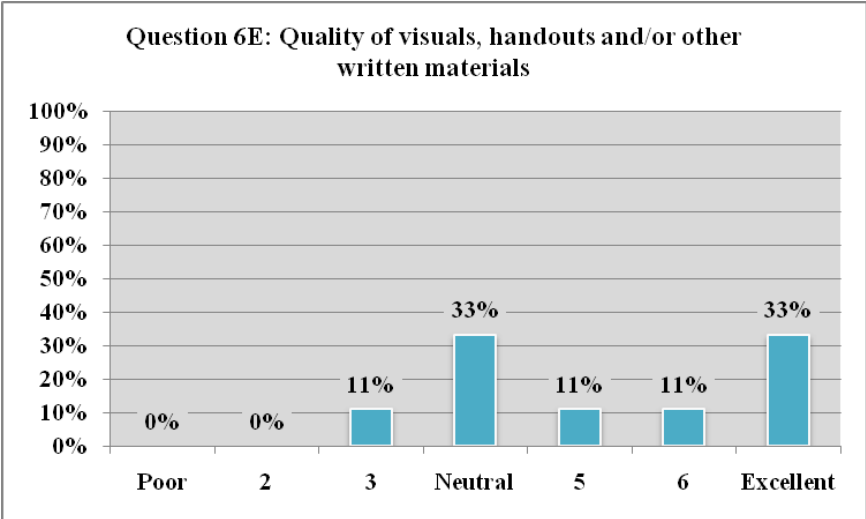
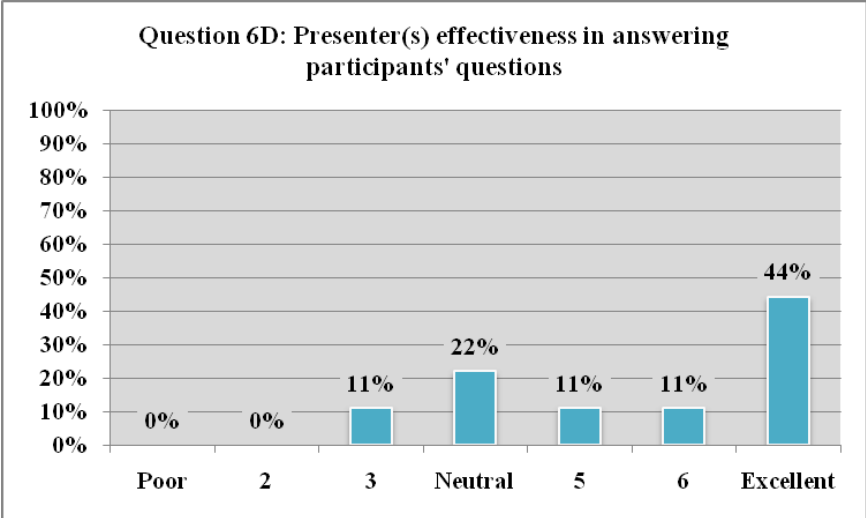
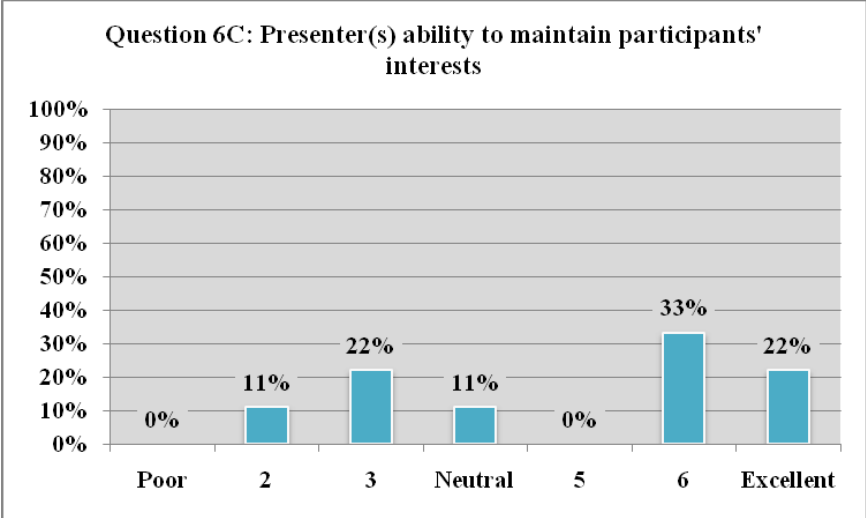


Question 5: To what degree was the content of workshop/panel applicable to your job?
